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# 1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

## 1.1. Legal basis

## 1.2. Explanatory statement

This amending budget has been prepared in order to comply with Agency's Financial Regulation and mainly to :

- in the section revenue: record the actual income (€ 40,000 instead of € 100,000) received from the Basque Regional Government for the year 2016;

- in the section expenditure: decrease the budget items "1100 - Basic salaries" (- €30,000), "2020 - Water, gas, electricity and heating" (- €3,000), "2210 - New and replacement purchases, furniture maintenance and repair" (- €12,000), "2300 - Stationery and office supplies" (- €2,000), "2331 - Audit services" (- €9,000) & "2400 - Postage and delivery charges" (- €4,000) for a total amount of €60,000;

- in the section expenditure: include the transfers of appropriations TR/01/16, TR/02/16, TR/03/16, TR/04/16, TR/05/16 & TR/06/16 following respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet .

## 2. JUSTIFICATION OF MAIN HEADINGS

### 2.1. Revenue 2016

The estimated sources of revenue for 2016 are :

- a subsidy from the European Union of **€14,679,000** which consists in :
  - **€14,663,000**: main subsidy from the European Union to be voted by the Budget Authority;
  - **€16,000** : budget outturn 2014 to be returned to the European Commission in 2015;
- **€404,700** of EEA-EFTA funds which are 2,76% applied to the main subsidy from the European Union;
- a total of **€100,100** from Spanish and local authorities.
- an earmarked revenue of **€941,294.82** for the Pilot Project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers", result of the extension of the duration of the agreement until 2016 and therefore respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016;
- an earmarked revenue of **€138,059.16** for the ENPI programme, result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016;
- an earmarked revenue of **€410,000.00** for the New IPA II programme, result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016.

The total estimated revenue in 2016 is therefore **€16,673,154**.

## **2.2. Expenditure 2016**

### **Title 1 - Staff**

The amending budget 2 includes the transfers of appropriations TR/03/16, TR/04/16 & TR/06/16 following respective earlier Director's decisions and communication to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The amending budget 2 also decreases the budget item "1100 - Basic salaries" is by €30,000.

The calculation for Title 1 is based on the assumption that the equivalent of **41 Temporary Agents, 24 Contract Agents** and **1 Local Staff** will be occupied in 2016.

The new total expenditure under Title 1 is proposed at **€5,675,100**.

### **Title 2 - Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure**

The amending budget 2 includes the transfers of appropriations TR/01/16, TR/02/16 & TR/05/16 following respective earlier Director's decisions and communication to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The amending budget 2 also decreases the following budget items for a total amount of €30,000: "2020 - Water, gas, electricity and heating" (- €3,000), "2210 - New and replacement purchases, furniture maintenance and repair" (- €12,000), "2300 - Stationery and office supplies" (- €2,000), "2331 - Audit services" (- €9,000) & "2400 - Postage and delivery charges" (- €4,000).

The new total expenditure under Title 2 is proposed at **€1,349,950**.

### **Title 3 - Operational expenditure**

Total expenditure under Title 3 is proposed at **€8,158,750**.

Operational expenditure is related to the implementation of the 2016 Annual Management Plan.

### **Title 4 - Expenditure for implementing special projects funded by specific other subsidy**

The total earmarked expenditure in 2016 for the Pilot Project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers" is **€941,294.82**, is the result of the extension of duration of the agreement until 2016 and therefore respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016;

The total earmarked expenditure in 2016 for the European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument (ENPI) is **€138,059.16** and is the result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016;

The total earmarked expenditure in 2016 for the New IPA II programme is **€410,000.00** and is the result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2015 appropriations to 2016.

Total expenditure under Title 4 is proposed at **€1,489,353.98**

### **Title 5 - Reserve**

This title is included to provide for any expenditure which were to be approved in reserve.

The total expenditure in 2016 is therefore **€16,673,154**.
