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1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

1.1. Legal basis

1.2. Explanatory statement

This amending budget has been prepared in order to comply with Agency's Financial Regulation in order to:

- in the section revenue: record the actual income (€ 40,000 instead of € 100,000) received from the Basque Regional Government;
- in the section expenditure: transfer of appropriations of € 50,100 from Title 1 budget item "1100 Basic Salaries" to Title 2 budget item "2120 Services provided by I.T. staff"
- in the section expenditure: decrease the budget item "2000 Rent" of € 60,000 corresponding to the effective decrease of the annual income received from Basque Regional Government (€ 40.000 instead of € 100.000):
- in the section expenditure: include the transfers of appropriations TR/03/14, TR/04/14, TR/05/14, TR/06/14, TR/08/14, TR/09/14, TR/10/14, TR/11/14, TR/11/14, TR/11/14 & TR/13/14 following respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet;
- in the section expenditure: amend the budget remark of budget item "2331 Audit services" to "This appropriation is intended to cover expenses for both internal and external conducted on the Agency".

2. JUSTIFICATION OF MAIN HEADINGS

2.1. Revenue 2014

The estimated sources of revenue for 2014 are:

- a subsidy from the European Union of € 14,094,900 which consists in :
 - € 14,013,900 : main subsidy from the European Union voted by the Budget Authority;
 - € 81,000 : budget outturn 2012 returned to the European Commission in 2013;
- € 424,621 of EEA-EFTA funds which are 3,03% applied to the main subsidy from the European Union;
- a total of € 100,100 from Spanish and local authorities.
- a earmarked revenue of <u>€ 450,296.58</u> for the programme IPA III, result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2013 appropriations (€ 330,754.58) to 2014 and last instalment of pre-financing for the project received in 2014 (€ 119,542.00).
- a earmarked revenue of € 1,997,512.15 for the Pilot Project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers", result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2013 appropriations (€ 1,647,512.15) to 2014 and second instalment of pre-financing for the project received in 2014 (€ 350,000).
- a earmarked revenue of € 188,596.00 for the ENPI programme, result of the first pre-financing received in 2014.

The total estimated revenue in 2014 is therefore € 17,256,026.

2.2. Expenditure 2014

Title 1 - Staff

The amending budget 2 includes the transfers of appropriations TR/03/14, TR/05/14, TR/07/14 & TR/09/14 following respective earlier Director's decision and communication to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The budget item "1100 - Basic salaries" is decreased by EUR 50,100 for transferring the corresponding appropriations to budget item "2120 - Services provided by I.T. staff".

The total expenditure under Title 1 is € 5,556,100. Compared to the first amending budget 2014, this corresponds to a decrease of € 50,100.

Title 2 - Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure

The budget item "2000 - Rent" is decreased by € 60,000 corresponding to the effective decrease of the annual income received in 2014 from the Basque Regional Government.

The budget item "2120 - Services provided by I.T. staff" is increased by € 50,100 in order to revise and test the Agency's Business Continuity Plan.

The amending budget 2 also includes the transfers of appropriations TR/04/14, TR/10/14, TR/11/14, TR/12/14 & TR/13/14 following respective earlier Director's decisions and communication to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The new total expenditure under Title 2 is € 1,370,575. Compared to the first amending budget 2014, this corresponds to a decrease of € 9,900.

Title 3 - Operational expenditure

The amending budget 2 includes the transfers of appropriations TR/06/14 & TR/08/14 following respective earlier Director's decisions and communication to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

Total expenditure under Title 3 is € 7,692,946 and remains unchanged.

Title 4 - Expenditure for implementing special projects funded by specific other subsidy

Total expenditure under Title 4 is € 2,636,405 and remains unchanged.

Title 5 - Reserve

This title is included to provide for any expenditure which were to be approved in reserve.

The total expenditure in 2014 is therefore € 17,256,026.
