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1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

1.1. Legal basis

1.2. Explanatory statement

This amending budget has been prepared in order to comply with Agency's Financial Regulations and proposes:

- in the section revenue: the decrease of € 20,000 in the annual grant received from Basque Regional Government and the of record the actual income of € 80,000 received in 2013;
- in the section revenue: the increase of € 39,900 in the annual grant received from the Spanish Government and the record of the actual income of € 100,000 received in 2013;
- in the section expenditure: increase of € 19,900 for the budget item 2359 "Other expenditure" corresponding to the effective increase of the annual income for the Agency in 2013;
- in the section expenditure: inclusion of the transfers of appropriations TR/01/13, TR/02/13, TR/04/13 & TR/05/13 following respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

2. JUSTIFICATION OF MAIN HEADINGS

2.1. Revenue 2013

The sources of revenue for 2013 are therefore:

- a subsidy from the European Union of <u>€ 15,071,880</u> which consists in :
 - € 14,035,000: main subsidy from the European Union;
 - € 643,900: budget outturn 2011 returned to the European Commission in 2012;
 - € 392,980 of EEA-EFTA funds which are 2,80% applied to the main subsidy from the European Union;
- a total of € 180,000 from Spanish and local authorities.
- a earmarked revenue of €558,740.23 for the programme IPA III, result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations to 2013 and second instalment of pre-financing for the project in 2013 (€ 119,542.00).
- a earmarked revenue of €1.650,000 for the Pilot Project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers", result of the respective carry-over/carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations to 2013 and second instalment of pre-financing for the project in 2013 (€ 650,000).

The new total estimated revenue in 2013 is therefore € 17,460,620.

2.2. Expenditure 2013

Title 1 - Staff

The amending budget 2 includes the transfer of appropriations TR/04/13 & TR/05/13 ollowing respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The new total expenditure under Title 1 is proposed at € 5.494,000. Compared to the first amending budget 2013, this corresponds to a decrease of € 160,000.

Title 2 - Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure

The amending budget 2 includes the transfer of appropriations TR/01/13, TR/03/13, TR/04/13 & TR/05/13 following respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The budget item "2359 – Other expenditure" is increased of € 19,900 corresponding to the effective increase of the annual income for the Agency in 2013

The new total expenditure under Title 2 in 2013 is €1.860,375. Compared to the first amending budget 2013, this corresponds to an increase of €179,900.

Title 3 - Operational expenditure

The amending budget 2 includes the transfer of appropriations TR/02/13 following respective earlier Director's decisions communicated to the Governing Board via publication in the "Planning & Reporting" section of the Agency's extranet.

The total expenditure under Title 3 is proposed at €7,897,505 and remains unchanged.

Title 4 - Expenditure for implementing special projects funded by specific other subsidy

The total expenditure under Title 4 in 2013 remains unchanged at € 2,208,740

Title 5 - Reserve

This title is included to provide for any expenditure which were to be approved in reserve.

The new total estimated expenditure in 2013 is therefore € 17,460,620.
