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1. GENERAL INTRODUCTION

1.1. Legal basis

1.2. Explanatory statement

The budget 2013 has been prepared considering the decision of the Budget Authority to limit the bugdet appropriations for 2013 at the level of the 2012 subsidy. An amending budget in 2013 shall be necessary if the annual EU subsidy adopted by the Budget Authority end of 2012 would differ from the current proposal.

2. JUSTIFICATION OF MAIN HEADINGS

Budget 2011 includes updates as per amending budgets 1 and 2.

Budget 2012 includes updates as per amending budgets 1 and 2.

2.1. Revenue 2013

The sources of revenue for 2013 are:

- a subsidy from the European Union of € 15,071,880 which consists in :
 - € 14,035,000: main subsidy from the European Union to be voted by the Budget Authority;
 - € 643,900: budget outturn 2011 returned to the European Commission in 2012;
 - € 392,980 of EEA-EFTA funds which are 2,80% applied to the main subsidy from the European Union;
- a total of € 160,100 from Spanish and local authorities.

Revenue for the programme IPA III is marked "p.m." as it will be the result of the respective carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations.

Revenue for the Pilot Project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers" is marked "p.m." as it will be the result of the respective carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations.

The total estimated revenue in 2013 is therefore €15,231,980.

2.2. Expenditure 2013

Title 1 - Staff

Total expenditure under Title 1 is proposed at €5,654,000 and includes part of the EEA-EFTA contribution for Titles 1 and 2 (€ 139,579 out of € 195 411)

Compared to budget 2012, this represents a decrease of € 5,117

The calculation for Title 1 is based on the assumption that 44 Temporary Agents mentioned in the proposed establishment plan for 2013 will be filled during the year.

The calculation for Title 1 is also based on the assumption that 24 Contract Agents and 1 Local Agent will be employed in the year 2013.

Title 2 - Buildings, equipment and miscellaneous operating expenditure

Total expenditure under Title 2 is proposed at €1,680,475 and includes part of the EEA-EFTA contribution for Titles 1 and 2 (€55,832 out of €195 411).

Compared to budget 2012, this represents a <u>decrease of € 20,825</u>.

Title 3 - Operational expenditure

Total expenditure under Title 3 is proposed at €7.897.505 and includes the EEA-EFTA contribution for Title 3 (€ 197,569)

Compared to budget 2012, this represents a decrease of € 2,590.

Operational expenditure is related to the implementation of the 2013 Annual Management Plan.

Title 4 - Expenditure for implementing special projects funded by specific other subsidy

Expenditure for the programme IPA III is marked "p.m." as it will be result of the respective carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations.

Expenditure for the project "Health and Safety at Work of Older Workers" is marked "p.m." as it will be result of the respective carry-forward of the 2012 appropriations.

Title 5 - Reserve

This title is included to provide for any expenditure which were to be approved in reserve.

The total expenditure in 2013 is therefore € 15,231,980.
